**SUPERSTITION MOUNTAIN'S PROSPECTOR COURSE MAKES *GOLFWEEK*
MAGAZINE'S 100 BEST LIST FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR**

- Nicklaus-designed course ranked among the best in the country -

SUPERSTITION MOUNTAIN, Ariz., (Dec. 6, 2006) – For the second straight year Superstition Mountain Golf and Country Club has been nationally recognized for its high caliber golf experience.

The community's Prospector course, home to the LPGA Safeway International, recently repeated as one of *Golfweek* magazine's "Top 100 Best Residential Courses." The course was also included on the magazine's 2005 list.

Compiled by the magazine's staff of expert raters, the *Golfweek* list is released annually and counts many of the nation's most storied golf clubs among its ranks.

"We're extremely proud to be mentioned in the same breath with some of the country's most prestigious golf courses," said Mark Kizziar, president of Superstition Mountain Properties, Inc., an affiliate of The Lyle Anderson Company, Inc. of Scottsdale. The 7,193-yard, par 72 course is a challenging design that has stood up to the most demanding of professional golfers. Designed by Jack Nicklaus and his son, Gary, Prospector features dramatic bunkering, undulating greens and fairways and one of the prettiest finishing holes in Valley, with a lake that extends the length of the hole.

The conditions of the course, which was the first Nicklaus course and only the second Arizona course to feature a Champions Bermuda turf for its greens, leaves even the most experienced pros amazed.

"I've never played in any tournament anywhere with conditions like these," two-time U.S. Open champion Curtis Strange has remarked about Prospector. And Jack Nicklaus himself has said, "This is the finest conditioned course I've ever played."

The women of the LPGA feel the same way. "...It's probably the best golf course, shape-wise, I've ever played," said Annika Sorenstam, who won the Safeway International on Prospector in 2004 and 2005.

Prospector has been home to the Safeway International since 2004. Prior to the Safeway, the course hosted one of the Senior PGA's four major tournaments, The Tradition, in 2002.

Superstition Mountain is an 890-acre master planned golf community in the East Valley. It is located one mile north of U.S. 60 on Superstition Mountain Drive.
